FROM THE PRESIDENT

How often we take each other for granted; how carelessly we often regard our freedom. At the end of this play, you will be able to leave the theater and go home or wherever you wish to go. For that matter, you can get up at any moment and leave; no one will stop you or threaten you, and your life is not at risk (other than crossing traffic on Vermilion Street). Over the next couple of hours, you will experience what life would be like without freedom; the freedom to come and go as you please; freedom to sing, scream, cry, or laugh out loud; and the freedom to express your faith to whatever God or divine spirit in which you believe without threat of persecution or death. Anne Frank's story is one of undying faith and hope in time of great peril; it speaks profoundly to the human spirit. Even at the end, Anne Frank never lost her belief that people are good at heart. I invite you to open your minds and hearts to what you are about to experience. Come with us now as we take you into those rooms where the Franks secreted themselves and into the hearts of Anne and her family, friends, and betrayers. My hope is that you take away a renewed awareness of the blessings of freedom and a personal commitment from this moment forward to work harder at ensuring we all guard our freedom and treat each other a little better every day.

In Anne's own words, "How wonderful it is that nobody need wait a single moment before starting to improve the world".

A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

First of all I want to sincerely thank the Red Mask Board for allowing me to direct this powerful show. I've always had a passion for it. I read the diary several times, performed on stage as Miep in high school, and after college, I visited the Anne Frank House which is now a museum. While at the museum, a deep emotion came over me when I touched the walls. The pace was both overwhelmingly claustrophobic and very lonely, a feeling I had never felt before. I also had the unique opportunity to stay with a holocaust survivor when I traveled with "Up With People". My host mother was an older woman and she opened up to me about her experience. She told me she was taken to the concentration camp, separated from her family when she was 17 years old. For one year, she was bounced from camp to camp, but her last few months were in a concentration work camp. She said that the reason she survived this terrible ordeal was because she "never gave up hope."

What does hope mean? In the dictionary, it means "the feeling that what is wanted can be had or that events will turn our for the best." We all have felt those feelings at one time or another. That's why we are able to relate to the story so well. This is a show about hope and survival of two families who were a normal as us.

As director I felt it was my responsibility for the cast to have a good understanding about the show and what lead up to the holocaust. I wanted them to understand their characters, I asked them to research their character and at each rehearsal tell me something new about them. I brought in a guest speaker, Heinrich Meuller, who was chief of the Gestapo and 4th in command under Adolph Hitler at that time. (I had an actor portray Mueuller from his memoirs and other Nazi documents to give a real account of what they were all about.) We watched *Anne Frank Remembered* and had a long discussion about it. We went to visit Candles Holocaust Museum in Terre Haute, Indiana and listened to Eva Kor, who was a holocaust survivor at Auschwitz of Nazi deadly lab experiments speak to us. The most important lesson we learned from Eva was to "forgive" and to "never give up."

I also felt it is also my duty as director for the audience to take home with them a piece of history and hopefully relay a message that we as free citizens are able to do whatever we want within limits of the laws, and knowing how history can repeat itself, we must never let this happen again. Thank you cast and crew for putting your hearts into this performance and bring it to life. Please, sit back and enjoy the experience!







JEAN LEWIS SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

Named after the founder of Red Mask Children's Theater, the Jean Lewis Scholarship is an annual award of \$750 to a student planning a career in the theater, performing arts, or a directly related area such as speech or radio/television. Area high school students as well as university or community students are eligible to apply. Applicants will be expected to demonstrate their ongoing interest in theater by their past participation in local theater opportunities. Performing artists will be asked to audition as part of their application. Along with a completed application, those seeking the scholarship funds must submit two letters of recommendation. Completed applications must be postmarked by April 8, 2010.


