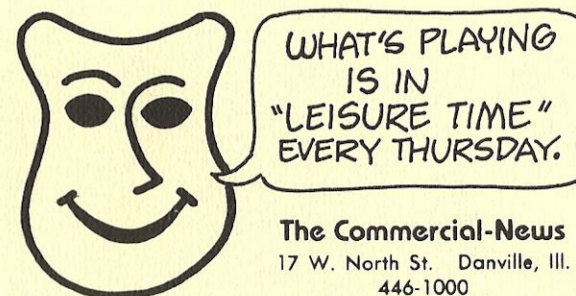

Over the last 18 years, Ron has been active in virtually every facet of community theatre work. He has appeared in 20 musicals, playing such vastly different roles as Cornelius Hackl in *Hello Dolly!* and Mayor Shinn in *The Music Man*. He feels fortunate to have been directed by the late Kathryn Randolph in the very dramatic role of Herbert Gelman in Red Mask's production of *Advise and Consent*. Last fall, he portrayed Jiminy Cricket and emceed the annual show of the Danville Chapter of Sweet Adelines. Off stage, Ron has directed both musicals (*On a Clear Day You Can See Forever* and *Gypsy* — DLO) and plays (*Come Back, Little Sheba* — Red Mask) and has served as a producer and stage manager. A past president of Danville Light Opera, he is currently treasurer and a member of the board of directors of that organization. Ron is Head of the Editorial Department at The Interstate Printers & Publishers, Inc., where he is involved in the publication of high school and college textbooks.

BARB SNEYD

Barb began her Red Mask experience last season doing props for *The Best Man* and *Don't Drink The Water*. This season she served as Stage Manager for *God's Favorite*, and portrayed Miss Manley in *The Secret Affairs of Mildred Wild* — her first on stage experience. A native Westvillian, Barb lives there with her husband Tom and teaches 6th grade at McMillan School.

Producers . . .

JANE PRICE, BOB TOLLIVER

The Price-Tolliver Duo brings a rare combination of skills and talents to our current production. Bob T. and Jane P., as they are more familiarly known to most of us, have labored many hours to secure the people who bring you all the proper accessories such as the costumes, furnishings, make-up, properties, and scenery that compliment and complete the finished presentation. In other words, all those involved except for the director and the actors are included in this category; but of course, Jane and Bob had a hand in that endeavor as well.

Robert and Jane have both acted and directed previously in shows, too numerous to mention here. Jane was last seen as the eccentric publisher, Miss Addy, during the '77-'78 season's opener, *Janus*; and Bob portrayed Walter in the closing production of *Don't Drink The Water*.

Bob is married to Wild Mildred (Debbie) and they have two sons, Craig, 19 and Mark, 16. Jane is married to Wild Wolford (himself) and they have an 18 year old son, Carleton.

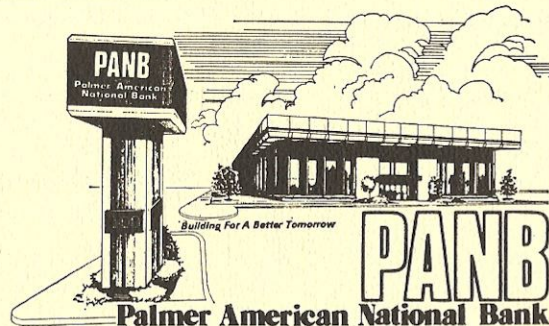

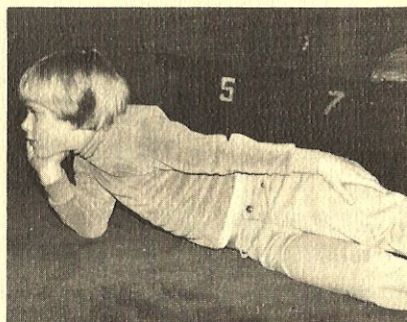

JACK HUNT (Kevin) — Jack's most recent stage appearance was as a rat in the 1978 Red Mask Children's Play *Cinderella*. At Edison School he is currently studying the part of Slightly in the Third Grade production of *Peter Pan*. He also played the parts of Felix and First Soldier in his class production of *Old King Cole*. His hobby is photography, but he spends a lot of time playing baseball, soccer, swimming, and riding his bike. Jack's parents, Bernard and Joan, and his sister, Kelly, are also active Red Maskers.

DAVID JOUVENAT (John) — If the voice sounds familiar, it's because David was last heard on the Red Mask stage as the Invisible Man and Warren, the TV announcer, in *The Secret Affairs of Mildred Wild*. He attended Columbus High School in Nebraska and the University of Nebraska — at both of which he played the title role in *Bye Bye Birdie*. A speech major, he was active in University Theatre and in 1967 was Stage Manager for the "Nebraska Centennial Show" with Johnny Carson. He is employed at Santec Mfg., enjoys singing, and is a member of the St. James Church Choir. David and his wife, Kathi, have two children — Christopher and Suzanne.

SUSAN FRICK (Janice) — Susan's Red Mask roles include nearly everything — acting (*Goodbye, Charlie* and *Wait Until Dark*); directing (*Reserve Two For Murder*); workshop participation (Theatre 601); and many backstage and committee jobs (programs included!). She has also worked with Danville Light Opera, Stage One Dinner Theatre, and Sunshine II. A past Red Mask President and Board Member, she currently teaches a D.J.C. Humanities course in 13 area high schools. She and her husband (Mr. Susan Frick) have a 3-year-old son, Ryan.

On Stage Tonight . . .

NORMA DAY (Grace) — In her fourteen years with Red Mask Norma has served in nearly every capacity. She was a Board Member for nine years and has filled many backstage and committee roles. Her many on-stage roles include performances in such productions as *Never Too Late*, *Come Blow Your Horn*, *Come Back Little Sheba*, *Delicate Balance*, *Forty Carats*, *Unwicked Witch*, and *Don't Drink The Water*. She and her husband Wilson have three children and almost two grandchildren.

HARRY FERGUSON (Fabrizio) — Harry's last Red Mask performances were as the cameraman, the construction worker, and King Kong in *The Secret Affairs of Mildred Wild*. In recent seasons he has also appeared in *Janus*, *Ten Little Indians*, and *Don't Drink The Water*. He has performed with Danville Light Opera in *My Fair Lady* and in the Sunshine Production of *Oklahoma*. Harry spends his days selling automobiles for Carmack, lives in Danville with his wife, Sandy, and has two sons, Jonathon and Sean.

BOB KNAPP (Father Mitchell) — *Under Papa's Picture* is Bob's first experience as a "man of the cloth" but he has appeared in other Red Mask productions including *Ten Little Indians* and *The Best Man*. Before coming to Danville he performed in *Natalie Needs A Nighty*. Bob is a pharmacist at the VA Medical Center and lives in Danville with his wife, Lois, and their two daughters, Pam and Elizabeth.

She enjoys backstage work and recently helped with props on *The Secret Affairs of Mildred Wild*. JOAN HUNT (Dupont Lady) — This is Joan's first appearance on the Red Mask stage but she has worked backstage on properties for *Play It Again, Sam* and *Don't Drink The Water*. She and her husband, Bernard, also provided a very important element of *Under Papa's Picture* — their son Jack, who is playing Kevin.
