Comments by Our Director . . .

Too often, a playwright is remembered for a controversial play which labels him in the public's mind. So I felt—quite mistakenly—that "Delicate Balance" would be shades of "Virginia Woolf." Instead, I discovered a different Edward Albee than the one I thought I knew. Albee treats, with a gentle hand, the problems involved with alcoholism, divorce, the demands and privileges of friendship, the ageing of a marriage. It is a thoughtful and sensitive play; one that shows a master's touch by his blend of antagonism and frustration with warmth and, yes, humor.
