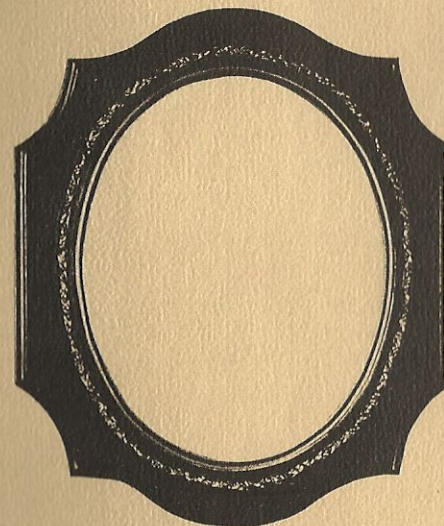

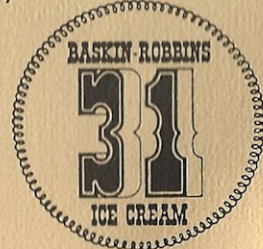

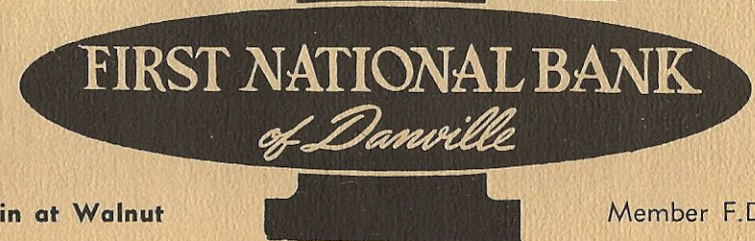
BARB SNEYD

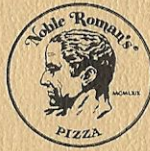

On Stage . . .

BETH FOYER (Myrtle Mae) — Beth is a native of Westville and is currently attending Danville Area Community College with aspirations of attending the University of Illinois next fall. She was active in the Westville High School Drama Department where she was involved in *Bye, Bye, Birdie*; *Christmas Comes To Detroit Louie*; *Lights Out*; *The Girl In The Rain*; *The Butler Did It*; and *Go Ask Alice*. She has also appeared in DLO's productions of *The King And I* and *West Side Story*. *Harvey* marks Beth's first appearance at Red Mask.

BARBARA STOVER (Veta Louise) — Barbara, a teacher at DACC, is a newcomer to Red Mask but previously appeared in community theatre plays in New Jersey. She performs regularly here in Danville as half of the Oral Interpretation duo, the Stool Pigeons, with Ilva Walker. They travel to schools and other groups reading poems and short stories. Even with her busy schedule, she still has had time over the years for many Broadway and Hollywood acting roles — "They never asked me, but I *did* have the time!"

BOB TOLLIVER (Elwood P. Dowd) — During his years at Red Mask, Bob has grown from an adolescent lover in *Cactus Flower* to a middle-aged eccentric in this production . . . and had a lot of fun along the way. A Katy Award winner for his role in *The Impossible Years*, he has served as publicity director extraordinaire, board member and Red Mask President, leaving very little time for his "real world" job at Steel Craft Products in Covington. Red Mask is a family affair for the Tollivers: Bob's wife, Dorothy, has appeared in *The Curious Savage* and *The Secret Affairs Of Mildred Wild*; sons Marc and Craig have appeared in Red Mask Children's plays as well as DHS and DLO productions. Craig is currently studying at the American Academy of Dramatic Arts in Pasadena, California.

HARVEY (Himself) — Red Mask is indeed fortunate to have convinced Harvey to come out of retirement to recreate his 1952 role (thanks primarily to the incredible persuasive powers of Max Sperling). Harvey assures us that he has stayed away from the Red Mask stage for only one reason — roles for his particular type of talent are extremely rare and he wants to avoid the pitfalls of type casting. He assures us, however, that if the right part comes along he shall return! In the meantime, he sincerely thanks you for your continued loyal support of community theatre.

JUNE PIONEK (Miss Johnson) — June calls herself "an absolute new-comer to Red Mask" who got involved through her mother, Joyce Hofman. She graduated from Georgetown High School in 1978 and is presently employed at Vaco, Inc. in Danville.

HONORE RONAN (Mrs. Ethel Chauvenet) — Not only is Honore a veteran Red Masker, she is also a *Harvey* veteran, having appeared in the role of Veta in Red Mask's 1952 production of *Harvey*. A graduate of St. Mary-of-the-Woods College, she began her Red Mask association in 1942 and studied with Kathryn Randolph privately from grade school through high school. Her other leading roles include performances in *Life With Father*, *The Heiress*, *The Glass Menagerie*, and many others. Honore is a past Red Mask President and Secretary/Treasurer and has also been active with Danville Light Opera since 1956. Other distinctions include Charter President of the Danville Toastmistress Club, Zonta Club, and Danville BPW Club.

JUDY KIRK (Nurse Kelly) — Although not new to Red Mask, it has been several seasons since Judy appeared as Edith Ann in *Blythe Spirit* and Fairy Mae in *The Curious Savage*. She was also in the chorus of *Take Me Along* with Danville Light Opera. Judy is a Medical Technologist at Lakeview Medical Center and has a four-year-old son, Aaron.

BOB KNAPP (Wilson) — Bob has worked in several capacities at Red Mask including set construction and props as well as performing in *Ten Little Indians*, *The Best Man*, and *Under Papa's Picture*. A pharmacist at the VA Medical Center, Bob and his wife, Lois, have two daughters, Pamela and Elizabeth.

JOHN ORSULAK (Dr. Sanderson) — Even though this is John's first Red Mask production, he is familiar to Danville audiences for his numerous DLO productions including *Annie Get Your Gun*, *Carousel*, *Sugar* (in which he played Josephine), and *West Side Story*. John is currently the President of Danville Light Opera, teaches fourth grade at Holy Family School, and is organist and choir member at Holy Family Church. A graduate of DJC and Illinois State University, John also appeared in Sunshine II productions of *The Sound Of Music* and *Fiddler On The Roof*.

GEORGE MAHAN (Dr. Chumley) — George without a doubt holds the distinction for the most varied roles in Red Mask history — from the butler in *Ten Little Indians* to a Presidential candidate in *The Best Man* to a guard in *Don't Drink The Water* to a chorus girl (and other roles) in *The Secret Affairs Of Mildred Wild* for which he won a Katy. Currently serving as Red Mask First Vice President, George has also served in many backstage capacities and has performed in the Sunshine Production of *The Sound Of Music* and DLO productions of *South Pacific*, *1776*, *Oliver*, and *My Fair Lady*.

JOYCE HOFMAN (Betty Chumley) — Beginning her second season at Red Mask, Joyce appeared last year as Bertha in *The Secret Affairs Of Mildred Wild* and Dinah the Cook in the summer production of *The Very Great Grandson Of Sherlock Holmes*. Of her involvement Joyce says, "I love the good company you meet belonging to Red Mask — and the appreciative audiences."

HARRY FERGUSON (Judge Gaffney) — "Star of stage, screen, and Red Mask," Harry's list of Danville acting credits is growing by leaps and bounds. He appeared in *My Fair Lady* with DLO and in the Sunshine Production of *Oklahoma*. At Red Mask his credits include *Ten Little Indians*, *Janus*, *Don't Drink The Water*, his unforgettable performance as King Kong in *The Secret Affairs Of Mildred Wild*, and his Katy Award-winning role as Fabrizio in last season's *Under Papa's Picture*.

J. EDWARD HANCOCK (E. J. Lofgren) — Since his first Red Mask role as Sidney Lipton in last season's *God's Favorite John* has stayed very busy in Danville theatre. He was Stage Manager/Producer for *The Secret Affairs Of Mildred Wild*, directed *Lil Abner* at Schlarman High School, and was Stage Manager for the DLO productions of *Sugar* and *West Side Story*. He will be directing *6 RMS RIV VU* this spring at Red Mask. A 6-year resident of Danville, John is on the staff of the Vermilion County PSEP and is a Fine Arts Appraiser. He and his wife, Muriel, have two children — Glen, 8, and Jaime, 3. And as his sweatshirt states, "YES, it's my *real* name!"

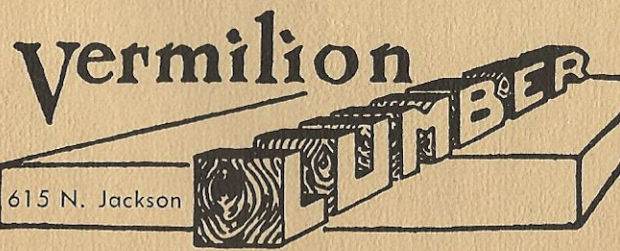

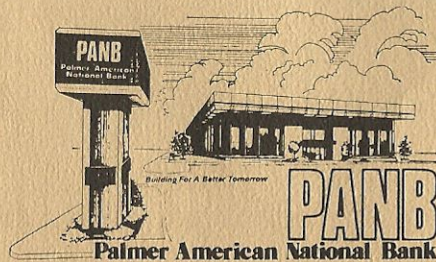

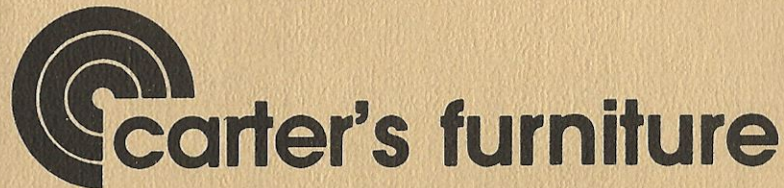
