

#### ACT ONE

Scene 1: A Spring Day

Scene 2: Six o'clock the following evening.

Scene 3: The Poker night. Later that night.

Scene 4: Early the following morning.

#### ACT TWO

Scene 1: Some weeks later.

Scene 2: Later. About 2 A.M.

#### ACT THREE

Scene 1: Some weeks later.

Scene 2: Three-quarters of an hour later.

Scene 3: A while later that evening.

Scene 4: A few hours later, same night.

Scene 5: Some days later.

# Beneath the Grease Paint . . .

Dorothea Perry (Blanche) last appeared on the Red Mask stage in Critics Choice. She is a long time veteran, having previously appeared in Life With Father, First Lady, Three's A Family, Silver Chord, Fifth Season, Teahouse of the August Moon, and Calculated Risk. Dorothea was also seen in The Women, presented by the B&PW as a benefit for Danville Junior College, and she was Assistant Director for South Pacific, presented by the Danville Light Opera Company.

Dan Smith (Stanley) is no newcomer to the stage or to Red Mask. Dan appeared on our stage in Critics Choice, Dark At The Top Of The Stairs, Man In A Dog Suit, Diary Of Anne Frank, and in the Childrens Theatre production of The Clown Who Ran Away. While living in Marion, Indiana, Dan appeared with the Marion Community Theatre in The Rainmaker and Kind Sir. He also directed both performances. Dan also appeared with the Rockford Civic Theatre in A Thousand Clowns.

Betsy Harpley (Stella) has four times won an Award of Merit for performances on the Red Mask Stage. Plays that captured awards were Witness For The Prosecution, Picnic, Dark At The Top Of The Stairs, and Tender Trap. Betsy also appeared in Man In The Dog Suit, and was the assistant director for the summer theatre presentation of Granny Davis And Mr. Death, the winning play of the Red Mask Summer Play Festival.

Jim Ovall (Mitch) just finished as producer of our last play Never Too Late. Jim has long been an active behind the scenes worker for Red Mask, and has several productions to his credit, including Holiday For Lovers, Advise And Consent, The Tender Trap, and The One Act Play Festival. He is last years winner of the Red Mask Award of Merit for Outstanding Service in a Non-acting capacity.

Ron Demlow (Steve) has appeared on the Red Mask stage in Stalag 17, Solid Gold Cadillac, Sabrina Fair, and Holiday For Lovers. Ron is a Light Opera Company veteran also, having appeared in fifteen productions. He is most recently noted for lead roles in Carousel, Calamity Jane, and Sound Of Music.

Sherry Bullock (Eunice) appeared in the One Act Play Festival in The Man In The Bowler Hat this past summer. Sherry is a valuable and talented newcomer to the Red Mask stage, and we hope to see much more of her on-stage abilities in the future.

John Barks (Pablo) was last seen on the Red Mask stage in Advise And Consent. Previous productions to his credit include The Diary Of Anne Frank and The Girls In 509. John is always a welcome addition to the Red Mask stage.

Linda Martin (Mexican Woman) appeared in several plays during high school, where she was made a member of The National Thespian Society. This is Linda's first appearance on the Red Mask stage as an actress, however, she has added her abilities backstage with valuable work during Never Too Late.

Steve Harris (Young Collector) is a past award winner. Steve appeared last summer in the One Act Play Festival in Granny Davis and Mr. Death and in the productions of Advise And Consent, Inherit The Wind, Never Too Late, and Critics Choice, which won him the Award of Merit. Steve was also last seasons receipient of the Red Mask Dramatic Award for students.

Karen Nielsen (Nurse) has been away from the drama scene for several years, but is now returning for her first Red Mask appearance, in A Streetcar Named Desire. Karen is also working behind the scenes on this production.

Fred Janesky (Doctor) is also making his first appearance on the Red Mask stage . . . but has long ago proven his worth to the organization. Fred is co-chairman, with his wife Marilyn, of Red Mask Tickets for the 1966-67 season.




