





DOROTHY (Debbie) TOLLIVER (Mildred) — The name Tolliver is certainly familiar to Red Mask audiences in nearly every direction. Debbie has participated in a number of areas in recent years. Her last Red Mask role was Mrs. Savage in The Curious Savage. She also appeared in DLO's production of

Oliver. Debbie's husband, Bob, is currently Red Mask President and they have two sons — Craig, a theatre major at U of I, and Marc, a ninth grader at Northridge Junior High. The whole family has been active with Red Mask. She has a B.A. from Indiana University, an M.S.L.S. from the University of Illinois, and is the Reference/Periodical/Microfilm Librarian at Danville Junior College. Born in Manhattan, Debbie used to ride the Staten Island Ferry to visit her aunt and uncle. And she confesses to loving Charlotte Russes!

VICKI CLARK (Fantasy Mildred) — Vicki is making her first Red Mask appearance in Mildred Wild but has appeared on stage before in productions such as The Miracle Worker and The Night Of January 16th. She received the 1974 Thespian Mask Award at Seeger High School and attended Purdue University. She is employed at Tru-Flex Metal Hose Corp. in West Lebanon

and lives near Tab, Indiana, with her husband Stan.





BILL SCHATZ (Roy) — Bill appeared in his first Red Mask play, Stalag 17, in 1957. Since that time he has been in many shows including Pure As The Driven Snow, Barefoot In The Park, Ten Little Indians, Don't Drink The Water, Mary, Mary, and Calculated Risk (for which he received a Katy). He is a

past Secretary, Treasurer, and President of Red Mask, has served several terms on the Red Mask Board of Directors, and has served on most all committees at some time. A prevocational coordinator for the Special Education Department at Danville High School, Bill's wife, Maryilln, has often helped behind-the-scenes at Red Mask. They have a son, Bill, and a daughter, Susan.

JOYCE HOFMAN (Bertha) — Although she has had private drama lessons, Mildred Wild is Joyce's first actual stage appearance. She is the mother of three teen-aged daughters and brought one of them (May) to Red Mask with her to help behind the scenes as Bookholder. Joyce lives in Georgetown,



does the office work for her husband's construction company, and enjoys spending time exercising and playing her favorite sport — racquet ball.

On Stage Tonight . . .

LIZ MILLER (Helen) — A true Red Mask veteran, Liz has served in virtually every capacity. She is a past President and Board Member and has directed Monique, Curious Savage, Ten Little Indians, and Don't Drink The Water. Her onstage experience includes roles in The Happiest Millionaire, Black Chiffon,



Mousetrap, Send Me No Flowers, Delicate Balance, Cactus Flower, Blithe Spirit, and Last Of The Red Hot Lovers. Liz is a Speech Clinician at Douglas and Fairchild Schools. Her son Matt is employed in Urbana, and her daughter Marti is a senior at Danville High School.



GEORGE MAHAN (Carroll) — George's roles in Mildred Wild broaden even further the variety of Red Mask parts he has played — a presidential candidate in The Best Man, a butler in Ten Little Indians, and the machine-gun-toting guard in Don't Drink The Water. Currently a member of the Board, George

has served in many backstage roles including Producer of God's Favorite. He is a Project Analyst at Bohn Aluminum and lives in Danville with his wife, Lori, and their daughter, Cindi.

NANCY NICHOLS (Sister Cecilia) — Nancy came to Red Mask as Rose Benjamin in the fall production of God's Favorite. Prior to that she appeared with the Kankakee Valley Theatre in productions such as The Odd Couple, My Fair Lady, and Jesus Christ Superstar. In Kankakee she also served as Assistant Director for Never Too Late. Only in Danville since June, Nancy already lists Max Sperling as her favorite leading man!



BARB SNEYD (Miss Manley) — Barb began her Red Mask experience last season doing props for The Best Man and Don't Drink The Water. This season she served as Stage Manager for God's Favorite, and with Mildred Wild she has moved onstage for her first acting experience. A native Westvillian, Barb lives

there with her husband Tom and teaches 6th grade at McMillan School.

HARRY FERGUSON (Rex Bulby) — Harry is familiar to Red Mask audiences for several roles he has played in recent seasons — Mr. Harper in *Janus*, Phillip Lombard in *Ten Little Indians*, and Axel Magee in *Don't Drink The Water*. He has also appeared in *Oklahoma* and *My Fair Lady* with Danville

Light Opera. He spends his days selling automobiles at Carmack, lives in Danville with his wife, Sandy, and has two sons, Jonathon and Sean.

DAVID JOUVENAT (Warren) — Another newcomer to Red Mask, David, his wife Kathi, and their two children came to Danville last June. He attended Columbus High School in Nebraska and the University of Nebraska — at both of which he played the title role in *Bye Bye Birdie*. A speech major, he


