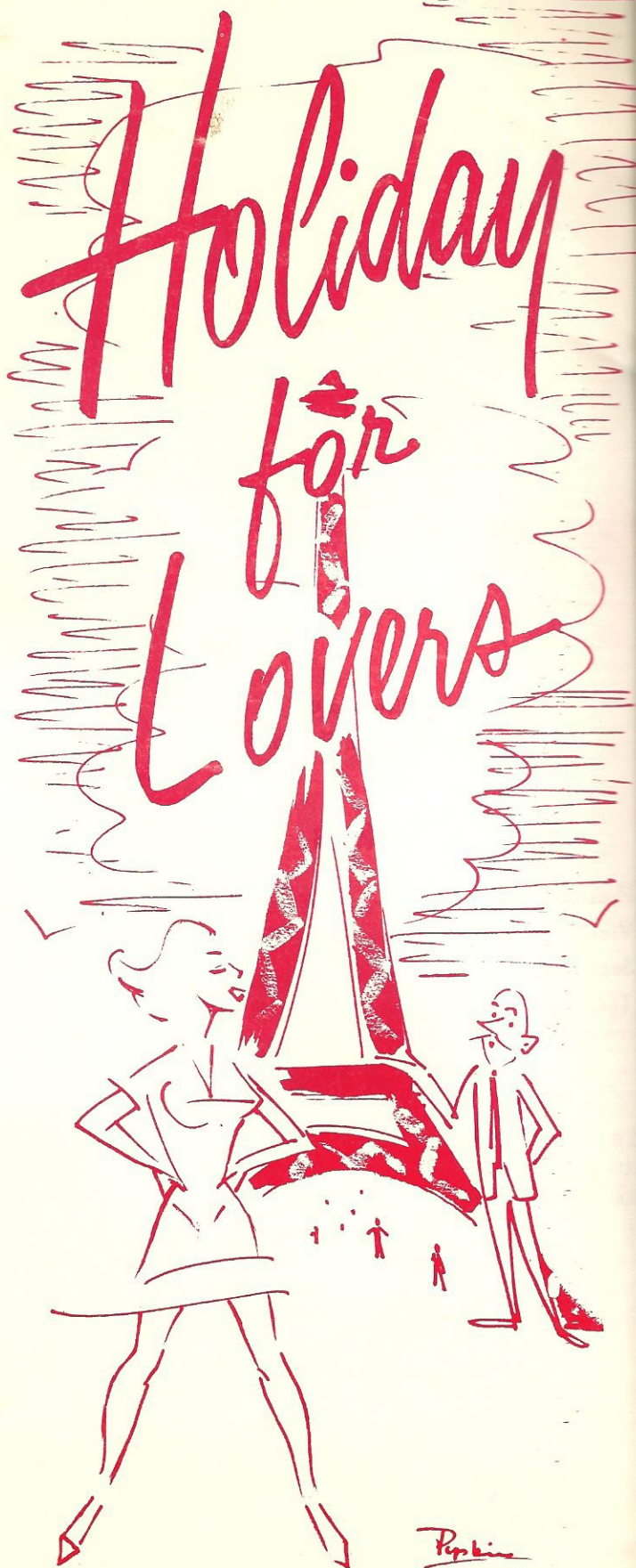

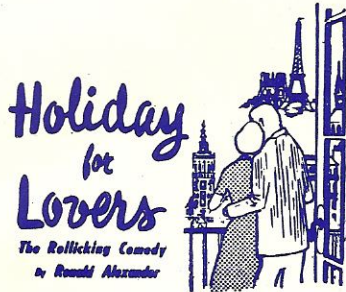

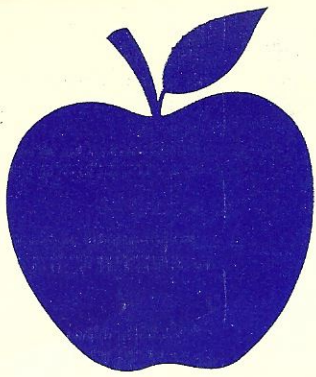
Lee Prewitt (Joe McDougal) is a student at the U of I. He was in two plays at DHS, but is new to Red Mask.

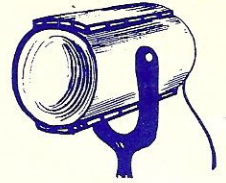

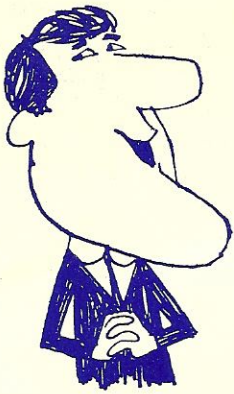

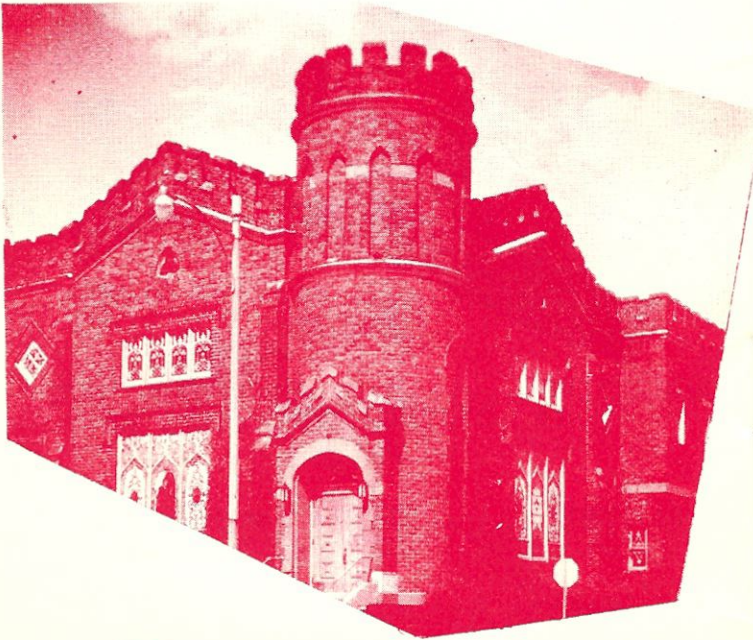
