


#### Chase Todd (Ryan)

#### JEAN LEWIS SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

Named after the founder of Red Mask Children's Theater, the Jean Lewis Scholarship is an annual award of \$750 to a student planning a career in the theater, performing arts, or a directly related area such as speech or radio/television. Area high school students as well as university or community students are eligible to apply. Applicants will be expected to demonstrate their ongoing interest in theater by their past participation in local theater opportunities. Performing artists will be asked to audition as part of their application. Along with a completed application, those seeking the scholarship funds must submit two letters of recommendation. Completed applications must be postmarked by April 5, 2012.




