

A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

Common reactions to reading *Brighton Beach Memoirs*:

"Great show, but can we find a kid to carry it?"

"Oof! A two-story set!"

"You know who makes a great Jew...?"

"Oh, God. It's my mother."

Care to guess which one is mine?

Upon first read of *Brighton Beach Memoirs*, I instantly connected with the play. I had lived in this family. I had been cooped up in this house. I have that mother.

My mother?!?! Yes, she is the woman known to many as the local newspaper reporter dedicated to providing local arts organizations the coverage they deserve. But she's also the woman I recognized in Neil Simon's autobiographical play - the one who says things like, "You're going to wear make-up right?" and then in the next breath, "I sound just like my mother."

While this identification ultimately creates great worry in me (after all, if history repeats itself, as it often does, I'll soon pick up something like *The Yiddish Are Coming!* and say, "Oh no - it's me!"), I am happy to exploit it for the benefit of the production.

While I may never have worried about the safe passage of relatives to America, I have lived with the Jeromes and seen these daily mini-dramas play out. That's really what *Brighton Beach Memoirs* is all about - the family dynamic.

So sit back, relax, and enjoy this family full of big personalities and bigger dreams contained in this tiny Brooklyn home. Although you may never have had to suffer through a dinner of liver and cabbage or asked your uncle if you could audition for a Broadway show, I know you'll find members of your family parading across this stage.

Mary Ann Laker - Kate




Janet Lewis - Blanche




