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

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
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

FROM THE DIRECTOR

Humble Boy... what can I say? This show means so many things to me, and each time I read it, or watch the amazing actors that will portray the characters on the Red Mask Stage, I find something new that makes me fall in love with the show. When I initially read this show I loved the connection to the bees. I love honey bees and always wanted to have a bee hive of my own. As I dug deeper into the show and author Charlotte Jones' inspiration for this show, I knew I had to direct it. I love that Jones takes inspiration from Shakespeare's Hamlet (without the tragic bits) and uses the family dynamic to create this funny and heartwarming play about life. I have been planning this show in my head for so long that it almost seems like a dream, and I now have the dream cast! Nathan Henderson brings such seriousness and likability to Felix Humble. I sympathize with Felix, as at times, I also feel like my life has not equated to much as I reach my mid 30's. Then there is Flora Humble, who is difficult, demanding and self-centered. Those things Nancy Henderson is not, but she plays her perfectly. Nancy is one of the kindest and most caring individuals I have ever met. Then we have George Pye, played by the energetic Jim Gilmour. Jim brings such ease to the loud and fun George. Seeing him and Nancy on the stage together again has been magical each rehearsal. Lisa Strain taking on the role of Rosie Pye, playing the onstage daughter to her real-life father, is such a joy to watch. I love the line where George says "She's not a looker but she's got character and I love her." I know that Jim means those words, not that she isn't a looker, because Lisa is a stunning beauty, but I love her part! You can see how his face lights up when talking about his daughter. Paul Strain who plays Jim the gardener brings such a passion to the role, and if I close my eyes I can see every garden area that he describes with such excitement. Then we have Donna Sant, who is the only cast member who isn't directly related to someone in the show, although she has always been like another mother to me. Donna plays Mercy Lott who is such a sweet soul, but not the brightest. Donna's comedic timing in the role of Mercy is flawless. All of these actors play their characters so skillfully, that it has been a joy to guide them through this process. My crew has been amazing in this journey
