JAMIE M. BRIGGS (Jessica) — Although a newcomer to the Red Mask stage, Jamie is well known to area theatre buffs — most recently for her role as the Baroness in the Sunshine II Ltd. production of *THE SOUND OF MUSIC*. She serves on the Board of Danville Light Opera and has appeared in many of their productions — most notably in the title role of *THE UNSINKABLE MOLLY BROWN*, as Eve Harrington in *APPLAUSE*, and as Ellie, the dancer, in *SHOW BOAT*. Jamie has also designed costumes, done choreography, and worked as Stage Manager. She wrote and directed a musical review for Potomac Junior Women's Club and appeared in several operas while attending Indiana University.

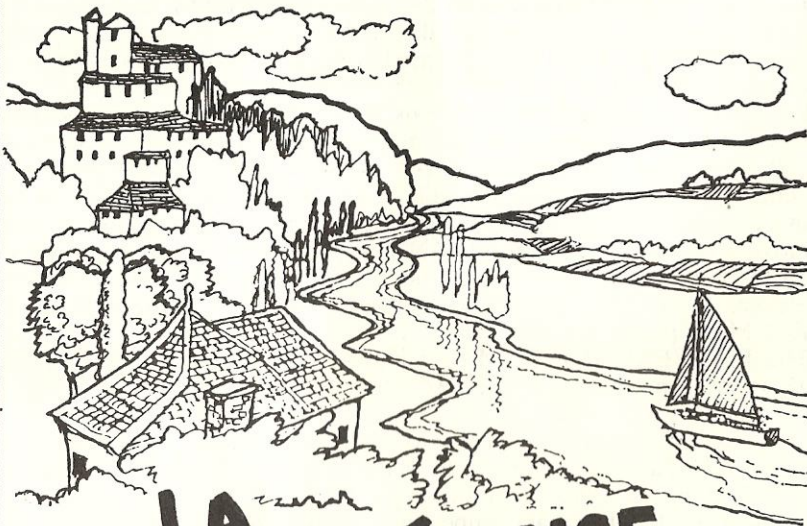
BILL EVERTS (Denny) — A Danville native with a strong theatrical background, Bill comes from a family involved in Danville Light Opera and Red Mask Players for years. He appeared in many plays as a child and, upon entering Danville High School, immediately became involved in the drama club in backstage work and spotlighting. Soon moving onstage, Bill performed in many DHS plays and captured the 1972 Best Thespian Award for his interpretation of Defense Attorney Stevens in *NIGHT OF JANUARY 16TH*. He also appeared in one Red Mask play — *EAST LYNNE*.

JANE FLOWERS PRICE (Miss Addy) — After an absence of nearly 18 years, Jane returns to the Red Mask Stage having been last seen as the maid in *BLACK CHIFFON*. During the interim she has acted and directed in several community theatres including Kankakee Little Theatre, Ottawa Community Players, Streator's Engle Lane Theatre, and Springfield Theatre Guild. She has formerly been active with Danville Light Opera and appeared in *SHOWBOAT* and *NAUGHTY MARIETTA*. Other of her roles have included performances in *YOU CAN'T TAKE IT WITH YOU*, *BLITHE SPIRIT*, *SABRINA FAIR*, and *SEE HOW THEY RUN*. A graduate of the Northwestern University School of Speech and Theatre, Jane teaches in the Communications Department at Danville Junior College and is currently a member of the Red Mask Board of Directors. She is married to the Reverend Welford C. Price, and their son Carleton is a Senior at Danville High School.

BERNARD HUNT (Gil) — Another newcomer to the Red Mask Stage, Bernard's acting career has been confined to skits in high school. A hospital administrator by profession, he began his career in military assignments in the Medical Department of the Army and subsequently in hospitals of the Veterans Administration. He has lived in Chicago, Washington, New York, and other cities in the U.S. from Albany, New York, to Salt Lake City, Utah. He is currently the Assistant Hospital Director at the VA Hospital in Danville and resides in Danville with his wife Joan and their two children, Kelly and Jack.

HARRY FERGUSON (Mr. Harper) — Having appeared in last season's production of *TEN LITTLE INDIANS*, Harry is playing his second role on the Red Mask stage. He has also appeared in Danville Light Opera's *MY FAIR LADY* and in *OKLAHOMA* for Sunshine Productions. A salesman and bachelor, Harry's orientations are towards theatre, sports, and women.

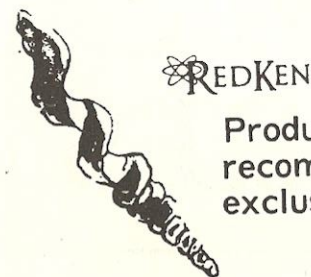

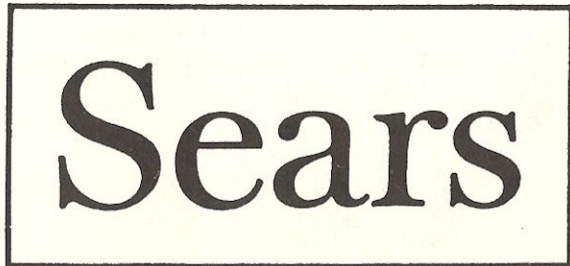

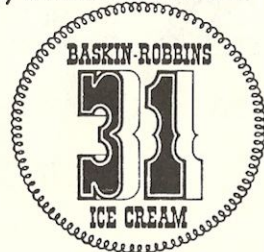
